

2022 PARENT GUIDE

THE FACILITY

LAKE AURORA CHRISTIAN CAMP 237 Golden Bough Road Lake Wales, FL 33898 (863) 696-1102

The camp facility has 75 acres of wooded oak forests with a freshwater, spring-fed lake. The waterfront is used for swimming, kayaks, paddleboats, and canoes. Sport facilities include soccer and softball fields, and basketball and volleyball courts. The cabins, dining area and meeting rooms are air-conditioned.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Campers should arrive between 3:00 and 5:00 pm on Sunday, July 31. Girls will need to bring a packed dinner for Sunday night - please make sure that the meal is packed in a disposable bag.

The camp will conclude with a show for families beginning at 1:30 pm on Saturday, August 6th. While the girls will be served lunch in the cafeteria on the last day, families who wish to arrive early are welcome to bring their own picnic lunches to eat outside. However, we ask that all picnics finish before show time. All family members are invited to attend this closing event.

SWIMMING

All campers will have the opportunity for recreational swimming. Swimming instruction will not be available, but we will have certified lifeguards on duty at the beach. To ensure the safety of each girl, only 30 girls per lifeguard will be permitted in the water at a time.



BOATING

Campers who wish to use the canoes, paddle boats, or kayaks must pass a general test in swimming for skill and distance. While on the boats, campers will be required to wear a life jacket (provided by the camp).

CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

One of the best adventures of summer camp is making new friends. We hope you understand that we will not be able to move a camper to another cabin. Each cabin will house no more than 10 total campers and counselors/counselors-in-training. Age and school grade are taken into consideration when making cabin assignments.

CLOTHING

Since this camp session is only 5 days, laundry service will not be provided. Campers will not need expensive or trendy fashions. All items must be clearly marked with the owner's name. Please limit the amount of clothes your daughter brings, as storage space is limited.

LOST AND FOUND

There will be a designated area for lost and found items. Any camper who is unable to find a lost item should inform her camp counselor. If any item is left behind at the end of camp, you will need to contact Lake Aurora staff to retrieve the item.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Mass will be offered every day, as well as the Rosary, and the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Spiritual formation at camp is entrusted to Opus Dei, a personal prelature of the Catholic Church. If you wish to attend our Sunday Mass on July 31st at 5:15 pm, kindly RSVP by emailing us at sandhillcampstaff@gmail.com so we can accommodate you and your family.

FOOD FROM HOME

We ask that the girls not bring food or sweets from home. It attracts wildlife and can create a "sugar high" when shared with other girls who may not be used to sweets.

HOMESICKNESS

When children are away from home for the first time, it is reasonable to assume that they may experience homesickness (of either a mild or severe form) until they become adjusted to camp and their surroundings. Homesickness is a very real thing; it is just as painful as a stomachache or a sore back. Understanding parents realize that this is something a child may need to experience, and encourage them to see camp through to the finish. This will help her to grow in independence, which will in turn help her to develop into a self-reliant individual.

MEDICAL CONSIDERATIONS

INSURANCE: Both Lake Aurora Christian Camp and Sandhill Camp have the requisite liability insurance. Campers are expected to have their own medical coverage.

INFIRMARY: Sandhill Camp will provide around-the-clock nursing services. If you need to send medicines with your child to camp, do not place them in his/her suitcase. Both over the counter and prescription medication must be given directly to our nurse, who will administer them as needed. All medication must be in its original containers and clearly labeled. Please place them in a zip-lock bag.

ELECTRONICS POLICY

When girls come to camp, we do our best to eliminate the outside distractions that might keep them from fully participating in the camp experience. For this reason, campers are not permitted to bring to camp cell phones, iPods/music-playing devices, gaming devices, iPads/electronic tablets, etc. If such items are brought, they will be taken away and returned at the end of camp.
